

'What's New' in O'Bryonville

When Peggy Marquette needed more gallery space, she convinced friend and fellow Hyde Park gallery owner Jean Morden to merge their businesses into Marquette/Art Finds Galleries and move to a new home in O'Bryonville.

There's a "lot of energy in O'Bryonville. It's the up-and-coming area," Marquette says.

"And the new space is wonderful. We have little niches for sculpture and we have bright colors on the walls."

The gallery's first exhibit, appropriately titled *What's New*, drew almost 200 people to its Nov. 3 opening.

The show, which runs through Dec. 15, features new artists and new works by familiar names.

Frederic Pissarro, the great-grandson of French impressionist Camille Pissarro, shows some "new works - more abstract," Marquette says.

In all, 18 artists are represented.

Among other works visitors will see are:

- impressionist/expressionist French scenery by Cincinnati Donna Talerico,
- unusual oil drawings from Lisa England Schuster,
- glass by Jeau Bishop,
- landscapes by impressionist Gregory Packard,
- watercolors by Cincinnati designer Robert Nowicki and Indiana artist Sandy Maudlin,
- pottery by Kevin Gonzalez and Melissa Flautt
- and Jazz Age paintings by R.J. Hohimer.
